ITINERARY:

Day 0: Tuesday, June 8: Fly to Oslo on airline of your choice.

Day 1: Wednesday, June 9: Arrive Oslo. Take train to "Oslo S" (The main train station in Oslo.) Walk approx. 3 blocks to Comfort Hotel Børsparken, Tollbugate 4, Oslo and check in. The tour starts when we meet in lobby at



6pm to get to know each other and go out to eat a Welcome Dinner at an historic restaurant in Oslo. Short walking tour of central Oslo.

Day 2: Thursday, June 10:

Sightseeing in Oslo including new Opera House, Folk Museum, Kon-Tiki Museum, Akerhus Fortress and Norwegian Resistance Museum. Possible meeting with Norwegian folk dance group. Overnight at Comfort Hotel Børsparken .

Day 3: Friday, June 11: Train to Drammen. Begin weekend workshop at Danvik folkehøgskole ("college"): Join 50-70 other international folk dancers from all over Norway in a weekend of dancing, live music and instruction, led by Lee Otterholt. Dinner and overnight at Danvik.

Day 4: Saturday June 12: Weekend Workshop continues. All meals included from Friday dinner to Sunday lunch.

Day 5: Sunday, June 13: Weekend Workshop concludes with lunch at Danvik. After tearful farewell to new folk dance friends, drive through picturesque towns on the south coast of Norway to Kragerø (birthplace of Thor Heyerdahl). Ferry to Denmark. Overnight in Plesner Hotel in beautiful Skagen.

Day 6: Monday, June 14: Explore picturesque Skagen at the very tip of the Jutland peninsula. Nature walk to where the Skagerrak meets the Kattegat Straight. (You can stand with a foot in each sea!) or visit museum of famous local artists. Meeting with local Danish folk dance group in Hjørring in the evening. Overnight Plesner Hotel.

Day 7: Tuesday, June 15: Drive down Jutland peninsula to Århus and take ferry to Sjælland (the island that Copenhagen is on.) Check in to hotel in central Copenhagen.

Day 8: Wednesday, June 16: Guided city tour in the morning. Free in the afternoon. (Visit Tivoli?) Overnight same hotel in central Copenhagen.

Day 9: Thursday, June 17: Drive to Helsingør and visit Hamlet's castle, "Elsinor" (actual name: Kronborg Castle). Ferry to Sweden then drive up Swedish West Coast to Nääs Palace. Overnight in the historic buildings of the Nääs Palace!

Day 10: Friday, June 18: drive in to Gothenburg to celebrate Midsummer's Eve

there during the day, then drive to back to Nääs where we will be guests at a dance party with live music and many Swedish dancers in the “Lekhuset” (“Playhouse”) on the grounds, then witness a dramatic recreation of a Medieval Torch Dance Ceremony at midnight.

Day 11: Saturday June 19: Morning free to explore the Nääs Palace and grounds, then witness the recreation of a 19th Century “bondbröllop” “farmer’s wedding”) at Nääs in the afternoon. Overnight again at Nääs.

Day 12: Sunday, June 20: Drive to historic Fredrikstad, stopping at Tanum to see ancient “helleristinger” (petroglyphs). Walking tour of the Old Town within the Fredrikstad Fortress. Overnight at Quality Hotel in Fredrikstad. Possible meeting with international folkdance group.

Day 13: Monday, June 21: Drive up beautiful west shore of the Oslo Fjord, visiting the quaint town of Drøbak (where Lee lived before moving to the US) and dancing with local international folk dancers there before arriving back at the Comfort Hotel Børsparken in Oslo and a (tearful!) farewell dinner.

Day 14: Tuesday, June 22: Fly back to US. (The is very near the main Oslo train station (“Oslo S”). Trains run from there to the OSL airport all day and night.)

Day 14: Tuesday, June 22: Morning train to Bergen, over top of the Norwegian mountains. Explore Bergen afternoon/evening. Overnight in hotel.

Day 15: Wednesday, June 23: Take morning train to Voss, then bus to Gudvangen to fjord cruise through spectacular scenery to Flåm. Then take Europe's steepest railroad from sea level at Flåm to the snowy mountain tops at Myrdal to catch the train back to Oslo. Overnight at Comfort Hotel Børsparken in Oslo.

Day 15: Thursday, June 24: Fly back to US. (The Comfort Hotel Børsparken is very close to the Oslo S train station. Trains run from there to the OSL airport all day and night.)

Lee Otterholt, born in the USA of Norwegian-American parents, has lived and worked most of his life in Norway as a professional dancer, teacher, and choreographer. He founded the Center for International Folk Dance in Oslo; he was also professor of dance folklore at the Norwegian National College of Ballet, and University College of Oslo. Lee established folk dance and performing groups in Norway, taught at festivals and workshops throughout Europe, United States, and East Asia, and is the author of folk dance and instructional manuals used in Norwegian schools. Lee was one of the choreographers for the Opening Ceremony of the Winter Olympic Games in Lillehammer.
